Public Health Preparedness at AppHealthCare

AppHealthCare is the local health department for Alleghany, Ashe and Watauga Counties. Local Health Departments are charged with public health emergency mitigation, preparedness, response and recovery.

Public Health Services Include:

Main Goals

- Communicate and collaborate with stakeholders in the community on all elements of public health preparedness.
- Using relevant and current data to create the most effective plans for all hazards.
- Practicing routine and non-routine epidemiological surveillance.
- Distributing pertinent information to the public in a timely and effective fashion.

Background Information

Incidents can range from a man-made incident such as a chemical spill or explosion to natural disaster events such as severe winter storms and hurricanes. A recent example is the Ebola Virus Disease, which created concern across the United States and globally. AppHealthCare released information pertaining to high risk populations, developed and provided training, disseminated crisis and risk communication, community stakeholder engagement around the events, as well as providing culturally appropriate information to the virus's implications. Another Example: Medical Countermeasures Readiness

- ✓ At a local level, AppHealthCare has points of distribution kits, epidemiology kits, respirator masks, and many other clinical and environmental supplies for public health responders.
- ✓ At the State and National level, medical countermeasures such as vaccines, antibodies, antiviral or antibacterial drugs, and PPE (Personal Protective Equipment) such as gloves or respirator masks are stored. The CDC has a National Stockpile of all the above equipment, and can be sent wherever in the Nation they can save the most lives if local supplies run out. AppHealthCare is responsible for maintaining all of these plans for distribution.



State Wide Effort

AppHealthCare collaborates with Public Health Preparedness and Response (PHP&R). PHP&R is the branch of the NC Division of Public Health that monitors and strengthens the abilities of our public health and healthcare systems to protect the public health in disaster situations such as disease epidemics, chemical and radiological releases, severe weather and natural disasters. Since the start of the PHP&R program in 2002, NC has established a multi-faceted public health preparedness and response infrastructure that involves multiple agencies and includes:

- <u>Regional PHP&R teams</u> that provide localized support and expertise to public health officials across the state;
- ✓ <u>Public health epidemiologists</u> based in our largest hospital systems;
- ✓ A <u>registry of potentially dangerous biological agents</u> possessed or maintained in our state;



- ✓ Recovery from Natural and Man-made Disasters
- Resiliency Building
- ✓ Epidemiologic Surveillance
- ✓ Data Collection and Analysis
- ✓ Food Borne Illness Investigation
- ✓ Communicable Disease Investigation
- $\checkmark~$ Crisis Communication

- ✓ Public Health access to the <u>Strategic National Stockpile</u>;
- Provision of potassium iodide (KI) for persons in NC's nuclear emergency planning zones (EPZs);
- <u>Public health laboratory</u> capacity for identifying biological agents, emerging pathogens and chemical agents;
- Model practices for <u>post-disaster epidemiological investigation and</u> <u>surveillance;</u>
- A statewide <u>Disease Event Tracking and Epidemiologic Collection Tool</u> (NC DETECT) that monitors disease patterns in emergency department visits, EMS responses and poison center calls;
- Strategic partnerships with <u>CDC</u>, universities, hospitals, community-based organizations, state and local agencies and other public health stakeholders;
- ✓ <u>Training</u> and capabilities assessments for local agencies.
