Our State. Our Wellbeing

Ashe County is one of 15 communities in NC participating in Our State, Our Wellbeing initiative which aims to focus on implementing strategies to prevent suicide and suicidal ideation and improve resources available for mental and behavioral health. This initiative will work with various agencies and organizations in the community.

Gate Keeper Training

AppHealthCare is partnering with two contractors to work with local organizations to establish policies and/or programs to address suicide prevention. Additionally, these contractors work with organizations and community members to provide gatekeeper training for suicide prevention. The goal of this effort is to equip individuals in a variety of settings to know what to do in situations where someone may be at risk for suicide.

SUBSTANCE USE & MISUSE PREVENTION



Using the opioid settlement funds, Ashe County authorized funds by AppHealthCare for the purchase of a mobile health bus. Additionally, funds will be used for further collaborative strategic planning to ensure a strong foundation for future investments.
